

Thanking your donor... In your own words

Drafting a thank-you letter for your award, scholarship or bursary

By taking the opportunity to thank a donor who has helped support your Laurentian journey through an award, scholarship or bursary, you are creating a special moment for both them and yourself. With a personal thank-you letter, you are helping them understand and appreciate the difference they have made by introducing them to your story and the ways it has been impacted by their support.

These instructions are here to assist in writing and structuring your letter, but it is important to note that it does not need to follow this exact formula. Get creative and infuse as much of your personality, experiences and emotions as possible to help your donor connect with your words—share stories, highlight your achievements and go beyond formalities to paint a vivid picture of the impact their support has had on your journey and future.

The thank-you letter should accomplish the following goals:



Convey gratitude

Express your thanks to the donor for their choice to generously support student financial assistance at Laurentian.



Express emotion

Use authentic, heartfelt language to highlight your appreciation and to create a connection between you and your donor.



Demonstrate **impact**

Share how this financial support has transformed your education, personal life or future goals and aspirations.



Be **personal**

As much as possible, include compelling details and information that is unique to your specific experience.

The letter should address the following topics and questions:

Your gratitude:

In what ways has this award, scholarship or bursary supported your academic pursuits or supported your personal journey? Based on the award description, are there any specific achievements, skills or character traits of yours that you feel it recognizes? What does it mean for students like yourself (or in your program) to know that there are people who support them, their passions and their futures?

Your unique personal story:

What pivotal moments or experiences have shaped your decision to pursue higher education?

How has your background, upbringing or cultural identity influenced your educational goals and aspirations?

Are there specific challenges or obstacles that this award, scholarship or bursary helped you to overcome?

Your academic and extra-curricular pursuits:

Why did you choose to pursue your specific degree or program at Laurentian, and what interests you most about this program?

How or where did your interest in your chosen area of study at Laurentian first begin? Were there specific role models, events or experiences?

Have there been any academic or extra-curricular opportunities that have contributed to your passion for this area of study?

Your future goals and aspirations:

What career or personal goals do you envision achieving in your remaining years at Laurentian or after graduation? How has this award, scholarship or bursary influenced your long-term aspirations and the impact you hope to make in your chosen field? What legacy do you hope to leave as a result of your Laurentian education and future endeavours?

The letter should include words and phrases like the following:

excellence cellence legacy commitment pportunity accomplishment creative transform education creative to aspirations contribution contribution recognition generous overcome difference future potential passion career future appreciation thanks goals skills influenced dedication gratitude community honoured generosity motivation oroud expertise possibilities challenge
